Title Inclement weather transportation services cancellation	Effective date March 12, 2015

Statement	<p>The decision to cancel school transportation falls under the direction of CTSE or its delegate, in collaboration with the operators.</p> <p>Even if transportation is cancelled on a storm day, the school remains open for students to attend. The decision to close the schools, rests with each school board.</p>
Terms	<p>It is understood that if school transportation is cancelled in the morning, it is also cancelled in the afternoon. This means that if a parent or guardian drives their child to school in the morning, they are also responsible for their transportation after the school day.</p> <p>School administrations are responsible for notifying parents of the different ways in which transportation cancellation will be announced.</p> <p>When the transport is cancelled for a region, it is cancelled for All schools in this region.</p> <p>Regions :</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Hawkesbury, Alfred-Plantagenet et Clarence-Rockland 2. Casselman-Embrun 3. Alexandria-Cornwall <p>School transportation can be cancelled for one, two or all regions</p>
Procedures	<p>No later than 6:00 a.m., after consulting with the operators or municipalities in each of the regions, a designated operator communicates with the direction of CTSE to inform him of the condition of the roads and make its recommendations.</p> <p>Based on the information received, road conditions, weather forecasts and in collaboration with a leader of the Student Transportation of Eastern Ontario (STEO), the decision to cancel or not to cancel transportation is made by CTSE management.</p> <p>Once the decision is made, the management contacts the radio stations, posts the transportation cancellation notice on CTSE's Facebook page and website at www.ctse.ca.</p>
